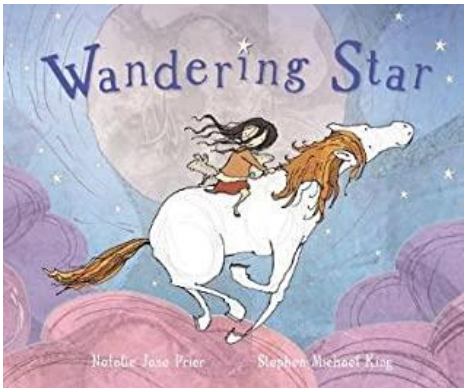

Make a Magical Treasure Pendant

What you need:

- Craft gems or collected treasures
- Air dry clay
- Rolling pin
- Cookie cutter
- Paints and paint brushes
- String

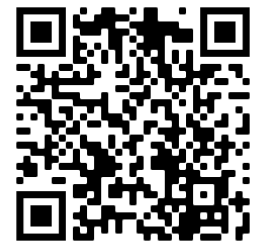
1. Collect treasures on a nature walk if you don't already have your own stash of treasures (e.g., shells, gumnuts etc.)

2. Make a pendant from your treasures:

Use your rolling pin to roll out the clay to a 5mm thickness (approximately).

- a) Use your cookie cutter to cut a pendant from the clay.
- b) Use a pencil or skewer to create a hole at the top of the pendant.
- c) Press your treasures into the pendant, and set aside to air-dry.

3. Once dry, thread your string through your pendant and wear it around your neck to inspire creative and imaginative play.

Optional- If you don't have clay, you can make your pendant by threading or attaching your treasures directly onto a piece of string.

- **Who gave it to you?**
- **How would you find your pendant if it was lost or stolen?**
- **Who might want to steal your pendant?**
